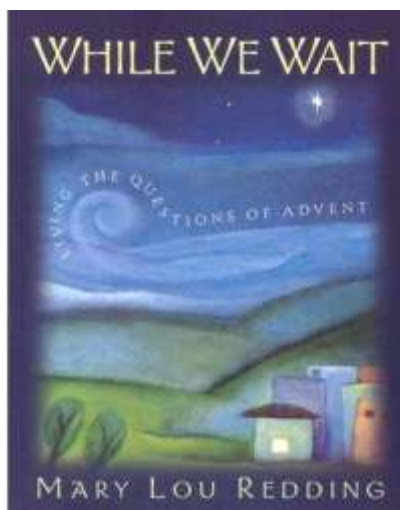

Interested an Advent discussion?  
The first gathering is Sunday,  
November 29 at 9:15 am, with Pastor Scott. We will continue with *While We Wait* by Mary Lou Redding for 5 weeks. The class will gather in fellowship hall at the Church. The first gathering will review the materials and we will look at a chapter a week after that. A copy of the book is available in the Christian Education office.

*“Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way.” – Matthew 1:18*

This time of year my memories take me back to my childhood and the buffet in the dining room. There in front of the glass mirror was the nativity scene. I remember working with my Mother to set up the scene, and we played it by the book. I mean there was no baby Jesus before Christmas Eve, no wise men before Epiphany. In fact through out Advent I was in charge of moving Mary and Joseph ever closer to the stable. Then on Christmas Eve Mary and Joseph took their places amid the creatures. Off to the side, shepherds began to gather with their sheep and the baby Jesus appeared in his bed of straw.

So you can see why Matthew has me bothered. Matthew **doesn't tell the story I grew up with on my buffet.** I am expecting my manger scene and **Matthew begins abruptly with, “Now the birth of Jesus took place this way.”** **Where is the introduction to the homeless couple seeking**

shelter? Where is the description of the stable, with cattle lowing and the baby lying in a manger? Where are the shepherds in the field and the angels **singing God's praises? Of course that is found in Luke's gospel.**

Sometimes this passage in Matthew is read and the focus becomes whether or not a virgin birth is possible. Now that is worth discussing, and our response will say a lot about whether we believe in miracles and/or the truth of the Bible. But is that why the writer of Matthew was sharing this story?

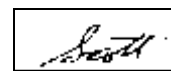
The story's center says more about theology than it does biology. It speaks about God and **God's initiative in our lives and Joseph's response of obedience. In Jesus God acted. In Jesus' conception and birth God acted, and Jesus embodies Emmanuel-- God with us. In Matthew's gospel that's what the God of Jesus**

Christ is all about Emmanuel. For Matthew the coming of God is not a yearly event at Christmas. God has been, will be and is with us.

Joseph was open to the guidance of God. We too can turn to **God, opening our lives to God's** revelation to us in particular situations. We pray, we struggle, and we listen for God in our dreams and in our waking. Then we act, trusting by the grace of God that our actions are divinely led.

**May we open our lives to God's** initiative and the coming of Emmanuel -- God with us this season of Advent.

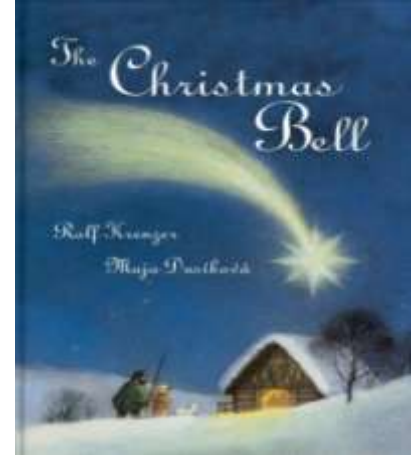
## Sunday School Children Sang in Church on November 15th

# Frequently Asked Questions at Town Hall Meetings



Town Hall meetings were held on November 1, 4, and 8 to discuss the Healthy Church Initiative. Approximately 30 people attended the meetings. Here are the answers to the questions that arose during the meetings.

Is there any financial obligation for the coaching?

The cost is \$1,800

SUMC is responsible for \$600 and the district and conference will cover the rest

The money is sent to the Iowa Conference ---it goes into the fund that supports stipend and travel for persons serving as coaches for HCI.

What is the structure for implementing the process and appointing teams?

A small team, varying in size, will be assigned to work on each prescription

A timeline is set for each prescription so they can be worked on concurrently

The full process is outlined in the Consultation report.

What is the plan about engaging people and how do we decide who will serve on the committees and small groups? What is the timeline for identifying individuals for the committees?

The teams are assigned by the Pastor working in conjunction with the coach

Each prescription has a different timeline but most teams will be identified early in 2016 so work can begin.

If you are interested in serving on a team or have questions about one, please see Pastor Scott.

Is there a mechanism to identify members

strengths to help from small groups/ committees?

There currently is no mechanism in place to identify members strengths.

However, leaders of small groups and committees can and should help Pastor Scott identify people who might have passion for the areas prescribed.

If you are interested in serving on a team or have questions about one, please see Pastor Scott.

How do we do this along with regular Church Council activities? Do we have enough people to get this done?

The intent is not to do this along with ALL other church council activities. The intent is to make the work of the prescriptions THE priority for this time in the life of the church. It may be necessary to set some other activities aside for a time so that the congregation can be fully focused on this process. Council doesn't drive it all--but the Council's leadership and involvement is critical.

How long is the process?

The coach will work with SUMC for 18 months as we work to implement and institutionalize the changes

The timelines seem aggressive, can we do this within the timeframe and the holidays?

Most of the early work is appointing the teams, then each team has several months to a year to make recommendations and implement changes.

As long as forward progress is being made, dates can be renegotiated with the coach.

When will the church do longer range planning, i.e. 3 - 5 years out?

Clarity of vision is needed first. The other building blocks outlined in the prescriptions need to be put in place---and then, long range planning can be engaged.

How are we going to pay for any suggestions or processes?

Any expenses related to this process will need to be approved by the Finance Committee and/or Church Council just as all other expenditures are.

What's next?

The Church Conference will be on 12/6 at 2:00 p.m. District Superintendent Kiboko Kiboko will preside over the conference.

A paper ballot vote will be taken at the conference, a simple majority of those in attendance will be needed to pass the resolution.

Absentee ballots will not be available.

Why weren't the consulting team leaders included in the town hall meetings?

The assumption is that the town hall meetings are for the congregation only so that the congregation can discuss the merits of the prescriptions or their concerns without outsiders present. Team members (or at least the coach) can be invited to be present if that would be helpful to get questions answered.)

Jill Sanders, the coach who will be assigned to SUMC, was a member of the consulting team and has reviewed these responses.

Many of these prescriptions are such that SUMC might well consider continuing with them - even after the initial goal & timeline have been achieved.

It is the hope that the work on the prescriptions does not end after 18 months. By that time we should be seeing results of the changes and con-

tinuing to improve upon the.

What will the "Time for Renewal" look like for pastor and lay leadership? Do we vote on it? How does it work? When will it be?

The renewal leave for the pastor is negotiated between the pastor, SPRC, and District Superintendent. Typically, it involves a 4 week period. It is voted on when the prescription report is voted on. The congregation votes on the report in its entirety. Congregations need to be creative about how to give breaks/renewal to lay leadership.
